Required Duration: 3 days or more

Target: C - International Conventions/Congresses

Target expenses details: Cost of public promotion, printing and binding, meeting venue hiring etc.

Upper Limit: 1,000,000 yen

Required Duration: 3 days or more

Participants required: 500 or more participants

Non-Japanese participants: At least a total of 100 non-Japanese participants from 3 or more countries Application Period: Must be before the host city is decided.

Subsidy for costs associated with Holding Small- and Medium-sized MICE Events Small and Medium-sized MICE Event Subsidy

Target: M - Corporate meetings, I - Incentive tours, C - Domestic & International Conferences/Congresses

Upper Limit: Small-sized events: 200,000 yen, Medium-sized events: 500,000 yen

Participants required:

M, I, C 50-199 participants (small-sized) / M, I 200 or more participants (medium-sized) / C 200-499 Participants (medium-sized)

Non-Japanese Residents: Not required

Application Period: Any time after the fiscal year the event will be held in begins.

(At least 70 percent of participants must be staying at least 1 night in Kyoto City. (Alumni association meetings exempt.)) Participants required: M, I, C: 30 People or more, Alumni meetings: 100 people or more.

(At least 50% of participants must reside outside of Kyoto City.

Non-Japanese Participants: Not required

Application Period: Any time after the fiscal year the event will be held in begins
